Dear Parents and Carers,

I have been filming around school this week to create a video for prospective new Reception parents. I have to say I was so impressed with all the children and how they were working so hard in class, the whole school looked lovely. The finished video made me feel really proud.

This week in Reception the children have been reading Lullabyhullablloo and using the 2D shapes to make bats from the story. They have been exploring 2D shapes and finding out about the Caribbean Islands. They have shared home learning on their families and where they are from and have located where the Caribbean is in relation to the U.K and discussed how different they are. Yr 1 have been learning about all the jobs done in school and looking at the difference between school now and schools in the Victorian times. Year 3 have been learning about the journey that Ruby Bridges had. We talked about segregation and worked in groups to think about how Ruby might have felt when she went to school. The children wrote a brilliant description of Ruby's first day at school. Y4 children have made cup telephones to test out how far sound can travel. They have also written letters to the Iron Man in English and completed some amazing addition work in Maths. Yr 5 have been making Egyptian head-dresses and their home learning models of pyramids look absolutely amazing. This week Yr 6 have been exploring our text 'Kick' through drama and how to convey emotion through physical presence. They have also started the Black History topic of Benin where they have explored modern Africa as a continent.

Free School Meals

In these really difficult times it is important to think about whether you are eligible for free school meals. If you think you might be eligible it is really easy to apply. You go onto the Lewisham website, search free school meals, put in your date of birth and National Insurance number. The main benefit that is eligible is Universal Credit, but there are others too. If you are on any form of working tax credit, sadly you will not be eligible. But if in doubt try!
