Our topic is:

Invaders and Settlers: The Anglo-Saxons and the Vikings

By the end of our topic:

Your child will know:

History/Geography

- That Anglo-Saxons and Vikings came from many different regions.
- Where the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings fit on an historical timeline
- These peoples settled in Britain and have helped shape the nation, leaving a legacy behind.
- About key aspects of human geography, including types of settlement and land use, and the distribution of natural resources.
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DT

- What the purpose of the product is.
- That the product needs to be designed for a specific audience, (person) and this will affect the appearance of the outcome.
- How to work safely using tools and materials.

Music

- How to listen and appraise a variety of songs and instrumental ensembles.
- How to identify the various parts that make up a song and how they affect the mood and tempo.
- How to explore and understand how music is created, produced and communicated

Your child will be able:

History/Geography

- To be able to complete a timeline of invasions accurately.
- To be able to use a map to locate the areas and regions where invaders (Anglo-Saxons and Vikings) came from and settled.
- To be able to discuss, record and compare the changes in society, housing and infrastructure, technological advances and modes of travel.

DT

- To design and make an Anglo-Saxon Brooch.
- To generate their own ideas and develop their design ideas through discussion, observation and drawing.
- To follow a given design criteria.
- To select suitable tools/equipment, explain choices; begin to use them accurately.
- To select appropriate materials, fit for purpose.
- To use design criteria to evaluate their finished product.

Music:

- To identify a variety of instruments used within a piece.
- To identify the style of music.
- To count in time with the pulse.
- To recognize verse, chorus, intro, rhythm.
- To identify pitch, tempo, dynamics and timbre.
