This term's priorities are:

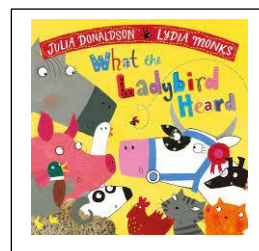
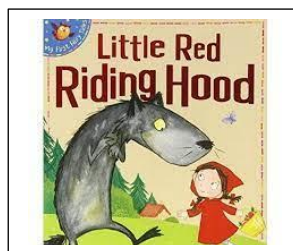
- To be able to sound out words independently and start to write sentences by themselves
- To recognise and spell the key words
- To talk about the main characters and events in stories
- To explore the numbers 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 and comparing quantities and combining numbers within 10.
- To be to use everyday comparative language for weight, mass and height.

Topic learning this term:

- Looking at maps
- Looking at different homes
- Finding out about the local area
- Comparing the countryside and town

Books we are reading:

- Little Red Riding Hood
- What the Ladybird Heard



You can help your child in Literacy by:

- Reading stories to your child everyday and visiting the Library
- Listening to your child read at least three times a week
- Practise spelling the key words and make it fun (e.g. finger painting, spelling words in shaving foam, chalk writing)

You can help your child in Maths by:

- Helping them to understand the quantities, recognise and write numbers 0 - 10
- Looking at combining numbers to make numbers up to 10.
- Making maths real at home (e.g. cooking and weighing ingredients, looking at height, pairing socks, counting stairs)
- time together

Other ways to help your child at home:

- Go on a local walk and look at different buildings and what their purpose is

- Follow a map together (tube map, train map, bus route, A to Z, a woodland trail)
